Year 6 SATs

At the end of year 6, each child will receive a raw score, a scaled score, and confirmation of whether or not they achieved the national standard ('NS' means the expected standard was not achieved; 'AS' means the expected standard was achieved).

The range of scaled scores available for each KS2 test ranges from 80, the lowest possible score, to 120, the highest possible score.

A scaled score of 100 or more means a child has met the expected standard in the KS2 SATs test; a scaled score of 99 or less means they haven't achieved the government expected standard.

Year 6

The SATS Tests

Statutory tests will be administered in the following subjects:

- Reading (60 minutes)
- Spelling (approximately 15 minutes)
- Punctuation, Vocabulary and Grammar (45 minutes)
- Mathematics

-Paper 1: Arithmetic (30 minutes)

-Paper 2: Reasoning (40 minutes)

-Paper 3: Reasoning (40 minutes)

All the tests are externally marked. We receive the results mid-July and then they will be reported to parents.

Writing will be 'Teacher Assessed' internally as in recent years.

How to help your child

First and foremost, support and reassure your child that there is nothing to worry about and they should always just try their best. Praise and encourage!

- Ensure your child has the best possible attendance at school
- Support your child with any homework tasks
- Reading, spelling and arithmetic (e.g. times tables) are always good to practise
- Talk to your child about what they have learnt at school and what book(s) they are reading (the character, the plot, their opinion)
